Dear Applicant,

We thank you for your interest in applying for funding from the Citrin Foundation. We are excited about the possibility of partnering with you and look forward to reviewing your proposal. Please review the following information prior to submitting your application to us.

Purpose of the Grant:

The aims and aspirations of the Citrin Foundation are to identify patients with citrin deficiency (CD), to improve the management, diagnosis, and understanding of the scientific basis of the condition in order to improve/discover available therapies and ultimately to find effective therapeutics. The Citrin Foundation strongly believes that a global consortium of scientific researchers and clinicians collaborating in an open, non-competitive, and synergistic manner will eventually achieve these goals.

Hence, the Citrin Foundation invites applications that align with the Mission and Vision of the Foundation in specific areas with the following objectives:

- Ameliorate the effects of CD on existing patients
- Improve the diagnosis of CD
- Understand the scientific basis of CD
- Find a cure

Eligibility Criteria:

Applicants must be independent academic staff of a University or Research Institute. Permanent research scientists from industrial organizations are also eligible to apply. Post-doctoral scientists, research students or Ph.D. candidates are not eligible. Applicants from all countries are welcome to apply.

How to Apply:

Before submitting a full application, applicants are required to first submit a 1 to 2-page project summary that describes their research intentions and key research areas of the proposed study. After the summary has been approved by the Scientific Supervisory Board, applicants will be

notified by the Foundation to submit the full proposal. The project summary should be submitted to the Foundation's Office by email at grants@citrintfoundation.org.

Funding Information:

As part of our standard practice as a non-profit organisation, the Foundation will not pay full economic costings of grants, which includes the Principal Investigator's salaries (whether partial or full), and any overhead or indirect costs incurred by the applicant's Institution. In exceptional circumstances, the Foundation may consider paying some of the full economic costs with proper justifications on a case-by-case basis. The maximum duration of grants shall not exceed 3 years.
